## DRIVING: NOW AN OLYMPIC SPORT!

A brand new Olympic event called a **AUTO OCTATHALON** will make its debut as an Olympic sport. **AUTO OCTATHALON** is composed of eight separate events, (duh) all of which occur **while driving a car** (duh).

- HOT COFFEE SIP.** The Octathalon begins with the most basic of challenges: drinking piping hot coffee while driving. How can we be sure it's piping HOT? Because our crack legal team has deliberately put the words "piping hot!" right there on the cup (although reading is a separate event).
- THE FAST FOOD CONDIMENT EVENT.** In this leg of the competition, drivers are given options of ordering and doctoring food from several drive-thrus. For instance, after purchasing a grilled stuff burrito from Taco Bell, participants, without pulling over to the side and stopping, are asked to unfold the tortilla and squeeze five fire sauces into the burrito and rewrap it. Balancing a drink at the same time raises the this event to true Olympic-level competition.
- FM STATION/CD TRACK LOCATOR.** Here are two variations of one of the event's most entertaining challenges. Contestants are asked to tune in specific radio frequencies or find designated tracks from a 6-CD player while driving behind a school bus. Fine motor skills plus a trained ear are essential for success.
- SPORTS PAGE.** This is a simple event that requires the entrant to check out the local high school basketball scores while driving. Though an apparently straightforward task, many athletes lose crucial points on the dismount where judges carefully observe the refolding of the newspaper.
- E-MAIL CHECK.** With the passenger's seat free of all other objects, contestants are assigned laptops. They must boot up, sign on, open and read emails in stop-and-go highway traffic. Added points are given for successful execution of IMs.
- MAKE-UP APPLICATION** (women) and **CONTACT LENS PLACEMENT** (men). Consider these the balance beam and pommel horse of driving competition. Drivers must perform these skills to the satisfaction of the judges. Scoring in these two events can be brutal and due to the subjective nature of the event, a new 10-point system is now being tested to assure that results are not fixed.
- SHAVING COMPETITION.** After years of consideration by experts, this event was expanded to include both women and men. Drivers use electric razors (what? did you think we were nuts!?). Faces, heads and legs are all considered legal shaving areas. Closeness of shave is seriously considered by the judges.
- Beijing is proud to be host to the first international **SUDOKU CHALLENGE.** This replaces the previous **Crossword Challenge**, an American-dominated event (due to the language of the crosswords being English). The Chinese Olympic Committee petitioned the IOC to employ the numeric-logic game, thus leveling the playing field. Drivers are given a puzzle and assigned a course. Competitors must complete both course and puzzle, and will be timed. Degree of difficulty (beginner, intermediate, advanced and samurai) will affect the total score.
